### ORDER

The Monitoring Committee on CBCSS (UG) held on 21/11/2011 considered the suggestions/recommendations of the Expert Committee constituted as per U.O read (1) above on the problems referred by CBCSS tabulation sections. Accordingly the Monitoring Committee resolved to recommend the following modifications in the regulations for the U.G Programmes under CBCSS 2009.

1. Classification of Results of Common Course.

As the common courses of the undergraduate Programmes will be over by the IVth Semester two grade cards should be issued to the students viz.(1) the SGPA in five point scale for the IVth examinations and (2) the CGPA in the seven point scale for the Common Courses – English and Additional Languages. In the seven point scale grade card of common courses details of all the courses (from Semester I to IV) shall be shown along with percentage of conversion of Grade points.

2. Classification of Results of VI Semester Examinations

In the case of VI Semester Examinations also, two grade cards should be issued to the students viz. (1) SGPA in five point Scale for the VI th Semester Examinations and (2) the CGPA in the seven point scale showing the details of all the Core, Complementary, Open and Choice Based Courses (from Semester I to VI) of the the programme along with percentage of Grade Points.

3. Classification of result as passed/failed

As per the existing regulations, a separate minimum of 'D' grade for internal and external are required for a pass for a course and for a pass in a programme a separate minimum of Grade D is required for all the courses and must score a minimum CGPA of 2.00 or an overall grade of C+ and above. As this stipulation may create problems, the committee resolved to recommend that the overall CGPA shall be changed as 'C' and above for passing the programme, instead of C+ and above in the seven point scale (CGPA 1.50 to 1.99)

4. Programme Classification.

The grade cards shall indicate the percentage Equivalent to corresponding points of CGPA secured by the students as follows:
