**AMENDMENT IN THE REGULATIONS FOR THE CONSTITUTION OF STUDENTS UNION OF
AFFILIATED COLLEGES/UNIVERSITY TEACHING DEPARTMENTS/CENTRES AND CONSTITUTION
OF UNIVERSITY STUDENTS UNION AND CONDUCTING OF ELECTIONS TO THOSE BODIES**

ADDITIONS	
Regulation 2. Definitions XXX- ACADEMIC ARREAR	Failed result in a paper or course in the semester examination. Under FYUGP, being absent for a registered examination or failing the examination attended will be considered as an 'Arrear'. Since the FYUGP follows a credit transfer system, failing to attain the prescribed credit points for a semester/course will also be considered as an 'Arrear'. Slow learners will not fall under the purview of this provision.
Regulation 4.1	Surveillance cameras/video recording shall be installed to ensure the transparency of the election process and to record the election procedures.
Regulation 4.2	University has the authority to take steps leveraging technological assistants aimed at simplifying and enhancing the transparency of election processes.
Regulation 4.3	The date of issuance of the Election Notification shall be the Cut-off date for determining and verifying the eligibility of the students contesting the election in respect of each prescribed eligibility criterion. This is applicable in both Presidential and Parliamentary modes of elections.
PART A Regulation 21 (4) Electoral Rolls	Only the students who are included in the electoral roll are eligible for appointment as Polling agents.

Regulation 21(5) Eligibility to take part in elections (applicable to both Presidential and Parliamentary modes)	
ii. Undergraduate students between the ages of 17 and 22 may contest elections. This age range may be appropriately relaxed in the case of professional colleges, where courses often range between 4 to 5 years.	ii) Undergraduate/FYUGP students up to 23 years may contest elections.
iii. For Post Graduate Students the maximum age limit to legitimately contest and election would be 24 – 25 years.	iii) For Post Graduate Students the maximum age limit to legitimately contest an election would be 25 years.

iv. For research Students the maximum age limit to legitimately contest an election would be 28 years.	iv) For research Students the maximum age limit to legitimately contest an election would be 28 years. * For B.Ed Students the maximum age limit to legitimately contest an election would be 26 years. * For 3 year LLB Students the maximum age limit to legitimately contest an election would be 26. * For 5 year LLB Students the maximum age limit to legitimately contest an election would be 24. * For LLM Students the maximum age limit to legitimately contest an election would be 27 years. * For M.Ed Students the maximum age limit to legitimately contest an election would be 27 years.
v. The candidate should in no event have any academic arrears in the year of contesting the election as on the date of Notification. However, students who had appeared for any University examination and are awaiting its results shall be eligible to contest.	v. The candidate should in no event have any academic arrears in the year of contesting the election.
vi. The candidate should have attained the minimum percentage of attendance as prescribed by the University or 75% attendance, whichever is higher.	vi. The candidate should have attained the minimum percentage of attendance as prescribed by the University or 75% attendance, whichever is higher. This provision is applicable to both Department Students' Union election and College Union election.
vii. The candidate shall have one opportunity to contest for the post of office bearer and two opportunities to contest for the post of an executive member.	vii. The candidate shall have a maximum of one opportunity to contest for the post of office bearer and a maximum of two opportunities to contest for the post of an executive member during the period of study without any distinction between UG and PG course. FYUGP shall be considered as single admission.
viii. The candidate shall not have a previous criminal record, that is to say he should not have been tried and/or convicted of any criminal offence or misdemeanor. The candidate shall also not have been subject to any disciplinary action by the University authorities.	viii. The candidate shall not have a previous criminal record, that is to say the candidate should not have been tried/or convicted of any criminal offence or misdemeanor. The candidate shall also not have been subject to any disciplinary action by the University Authorities. The candidate who has been subject to any disciplinary action and affidavit has been submitted by the Principal is also ineligible for contesting the election.
21 -7 Nomination of Candidates: a. Presidential mode of election: Every elector shall be at liberty to nominate a qualified student to fill up a vacancy.	21 -7 Nomination of Candidates: a. Presidential mode of election: Every elector shall be at liberty to nominate a qualified student to fill up each vacancy.

The Returning Officer is the authority to make final decisions regarding election related disputes from the beginning of poll up to the declaration of results. Complaints arising thereafter may be appealed to the Election Grievance Redressal Cell.

Regulation 21. 18) i a) Objection and Grievances Redressal	
COLLEGES	Grievance Redressal cell consists of: i. Dean(students welfare)/ Teacher in charge of student affairs as its Chairman. ii. One Senior Faculty/Professor iii. One Administrative Officer iv. Two final year student representatives. One boy and one girl
UNIVERSITY	Grievance Redressal cell consists of: i. Registrar ii. A Professor nominated by the Vice Chancellor iii. Director of Department of Students' Welfare iv. Two final year student representatives. One boy and one girl The Returning Officer shall not be a member of the Committee. The selection of student representatives for the above said committees shall be based on their academic merit and participation in extra curricular activities during previous years. The Principal shall be the College Level Appellate Authority and the Vice Chancellor shall be the University Level Appellate Authority. This three tier Election Grievance Redressal Cell constituted has to be a permanent cell.
